Collective Impact

Advocacy

In 2022, the One San Pedro (OSP) team worked on a state budget ask to accelerate the funding on critical project needs. We took our ask on the road and visited Sacramento to meet with key representatives. Once back, we began a Los Angeles State Caucus tour where we briefed more that twenty Los Angeles area State Assembly and State Senate members.

Funding

Dignity Health Invests in the Future of San Pedro

National CORE received a \$10 million funding award from Dignity Health to further the development of One San Pedro in partnership with the Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles (HACLA), Century Housing Corporation and The Richman Group. The funding will support future construction of Rancho San Pedro. With this funding, we are sure to develop a community that supports and empowers residents to be mentally, physically and emotionally healthy. Everyone deserves to have a home and live in a neighborhood where they feel welcome and cared for.

One Urban Strategies Cohort

One San Pedro submitted a competitive application and was selected to participate in a 12-month technical assistance cohort facilitated by Urban Strategies Inc. The program is designed to provide Choice Neighborhood Planning grant awardees with peer support and one-on-one coaching that will guide teams towards implementing activities in their target communities. Our team understands that there are significant barriers to community-centered development. Once we break ground, RSP will be redeveloped over the course of 15 years, our work today is critical to design place-based efforts that deepen the impact. Since 2018, we have begun to cultivate long-term relationships with key institutional partners and commit resources to social programs. The earlier we can start to align investments to support collective impact, the more likely we can secure long-term systems change wins that will improve overall health and equity outcomes for residents. We look forward to continuing our work with Urban Strategies Inc. in 2023.

Pedal Movement Envisioning Meeting

We started the year off with a bike ride around Rancho San Pedro. Pedal Movement led a demonstration and test drive of their electric bikes as a preview of the variety of bikes that will be a part of their e-bike pilot program.

Cornerstone kicked off their San Pedro Community play with a family-filled event at Rancho San Pedro. Amor es Futbol took place on Saturday, April 4, 2022. Rancho San Pedro resident actors participated in a script reading. The day culminated with a heartfelt friendly soccer game.

Partner Tours

The Rancho San Pedro Resident Advisory Council (RAC) and Community Coaches visited Toberman, YWCA, and the POLA Boys and Girls Club. Each partner visit gave our leaders the opportunity to learn about the provider, program requirements, meet with key staff and tour the site.

OSP Alliance

Our partners met in person for the first time since 2019. We held a mid-year strategic planning session. This meeting served as a planning session to assess our readiness as we prepare for the Choice Neighborhoods Implementation Grant application. The group discussed strategies within five key areas to target in 2022. Our partners highlighted the need for support in funding collaborative programs, data sharing/data collection, and program space.

Community Engagement meeting

As part of our commitment to the work and our partners at HACLA, we supported a Rental **Assistance Demonstration** (RAD) meeting. 78 residents attended and learned about the RAD program and relocation. Every family who attended received a grocery gift card.

Harbor Boulevard Park Improvements

General contracting firm, Lucas Builders, Inc. (LBI) was procured using Invitation for Bid process.

Construction started on September 12, 2022. Earlier in the year, Port of LA demolished the existing train tracks and associated structures and graded the site to receive new improvements.

LBI completed all the necessary demolition and grading activities by October 2022 in order to prepare for the site concrete work. The contractor hauled away the existing soil material on site and imported new decompressed granite material on site suitable for new planting material.

Concrete work completed in November and December 2022 include the Bosque area and planters on the south end of the property, half of Flex Space concrete on the north end of the property, concrete walkways connecting the new park spaces to the existing promenade, and landscape planting curbs.

LBI procured all site furnishings by November 2022, such as children's play area equipment, exercise equipment, game tables, benches, and picnic tables to avoid delays due to their long lead times.

Development Corner

This year, our development team worked tirelessly on some more behind the scenes items.
